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The 2018 International Fire Code (IFC), with the following provisions, shall mandate the following requirements regarding mobile food preparation vehicles, trailers, carts, or others:

MOBILE FOOD TRUCK/TRAILER OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS & PERMIT CONDITIONS

1. Trash and combustible materials shall not accumulate or not be located within 3 feet of the fuel supply.
2. Provide appropriate waste receptacles at the site of the unit and remove all litter, debris, and other waste attributable to the vendor on a daily basis.
3. Shall not be parked, situated, or operated in a manner that restricts or blocks emergency vehicle apparatus access.
4. Must have a current State of Texas Vehicle Registration.
5. Shall not be parked, situated, or operated in a manner that restricts or blocks fire hydrants, fire lanes, or other fire protection equipment or access.
6. Comply with the City of Krum's applicable ordinances.
7. Comply with all applicable federal, state, and county regulations.
8. Not represent the granting of a permit under this chapter as an endorsement by the City of Krum.
9. Exit signs shall be installed and maintained. Means of egress shall not be obstructed, reduced, and/or blocked.
10. Cooking operations in which grease-laden vapors are or can be created, shall be provided with a Type I hood and fire suppression system equipped with a pull station that is located in the path of egress.
11. Deep fat fryers are a minimum of 16 inches away from an open flame or an 8-inch steel or tempered glass baffle is installed.
12. The exhaust system, including hood, grease-removal devices, fans, ducts, and other appurtenances, shall be inspected and cleaned every 6 months.
13. The fire suppression system shall be inspected by a licensed company every six months.
14. A minimum of (1) K- Class fire extinguisher shall be provided if the potential of grease-laden vapors can be produced.
15. A minimum of (1) 2A-10BC fire extinguisher shall be provided.
16. All fire extinguishers must be inspected, in date, tagged, and mounted.
17. Propane cylinders shall be secured to the vehicle and installed in accordance with NFPA-58, and shall not exceed 200 pounds (91 kg) propane capacity.
18. LP-gas system piping, including valves and fittings, shall be adequately protected to prevent tampering, impact damage, and damage from vibration.
19. A listed LP-gas alarm shall be installed within the vehicle in the vicinity of LP-gas system components, in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
20. Propane cylinders and fuel-gas piping systems shall be inspected annually by an approved agency/company registered with the USDOT. The approved inspection agency shall affix a tag on the fuel gas system or within the vehicle indicating the name of the inspection agency and the date of a satisfactory inspection.



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21. Where CNG systems provide fuel for cooking appliances, such systems shall comply with Sections 319.9.1 through 319.9.4 of the IFC.
22. Cooking oil storage containers within mobile food preparation vehicles shall have a maximum aggregate volume not more than 120 gallons (454 L), shall comply with Sections 319.7.1 through 319.7.5.2 of the IFC and shall be stored in such a way as to not be toppled or damaged during transport.
23. All temporary electrical shall comply with the provisions of applicable codes and any other applicable city ordinances or codes.
24. Generators shall be in a safe working condition in accordance with manufacturer requirements
25. Generators must be located outside of the public way and a minimum of 20 feet from combustibles.
26. Generators cannot be refueled until 15 minutes of cool-down time.
27. Shall not block or obstruct access to a fire hydrant or within a fire lane.

Any change, modification, or addition from the conditions of this permit must be reviewed for modifications and impact upon the conditions of the Food Truck Permit. This permit must be clearly posted in a conspicuous place, or as mandated by a Fire Code Official, and available upon request. Failure to comply with the provisions of this permit, or when a violation is found by inspection, will result in revocation of this permit and/or issuance of a citation.
